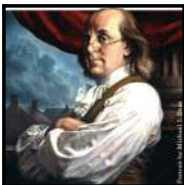

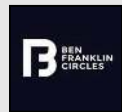
FC EARLY COLLEGE HIGH SCHOOL (ECHS) PROJECT UPDATE

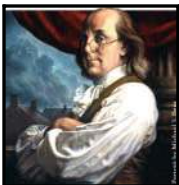
UNC-TV FEATURES PEGGY'S HEARTH & GARDEN ON "ALMANAC GARDENER"
