Colonial Hearth Day Status Update

A 2013 United Way of Franklin County Grant Application was submitted to secure help with the funding of our fall Colonial Hearth Day. The Event has been extended from one- to two-days so we can accommodate 200 (last year just 100) underprivileged 4th Grade Students from across Franklin County.

The Ben Franklin Society funds its own Projects, but also seeks outside Grants on their behalf. We raised over \$1400 at BreadWorks Events in 2012.



We secured Grants from both United Way of Franklin County and Novozymes for the Colonial Hearth Day Project in 2012.
