UPCOMING COLONIAL HEARTH DAY

Our 4th Colonial Hearth Day event is scheduled for Thursday and Friday, October 22-23, 2015 at Peggy McGhee's Farm in Franklinton. We have provided the Franklin County School System a Video prepared from footage shot at last years event and has been hosted on their website. Faculty and students now can view the highlights of the event year-round. We have been awarded a Grant of \$2000 by the United Way of Franklin County to defray some of the events cost. Each year we welcome over 200 fourth grade elementary school disadvantaged students to our Educational Field Trip.

FRANKLINTON HIGH SCHOOL COLLABORATION

Thanks to Maria Styers, Culinary Arts Teacher, we have begun to mentor Junior and Senior students by involving them in the workings of BreadWorks Events. In this way, students get "real world" experience in the food service industry. We expect to continue to expand the number and nature of student involvement in our future BreadWorks activities.
