BREADWORKS PATRONS

AFTER NEARLY FIVE YEARS OF UNINTERRUPTED MONTHLY BREADWORKS EVENTS,

I MUST ANNOUNCE THE SUSPENSION OF SUMMER (JUNE - AUGUST) BREADWORKS EVENT ACTIVITY.

IT IS UNCOMFORTABLE FOR ME TO BRING YOU THIS NEWS. WE HOPE TO RESUME ACTIVITY IN SEPTEMBER.

Sadly, staffing has become a crippling problem. For the past few years, BreadWorks delivered 20+ Advertised Events per year in addition to numerous unadvertised Private Group Events - that are usually Sold Out - meaning 30-34 patrons at Brunches and 55-60 at Tomato Pie Buffets. I would estimate that we have delivered 200+ Events - that require menu planning, quotation, food purchasing, preparation, cooking and wait service, as well as finding and hiring entertainment.

I sincerely thank all those who have worked with me to consistently provide an enjoyable dining and entertainment experience. For sure, without adequately trained supporting staff, the Quality of Service that we have consistently provided, is not possible, and I am unwilling to lower my service standards.

ALL OTHER SOCIETY ACTIVITIES CONTINUE UNAFFECTED

I started the Ben Franklin Society in 2009 to foster Research Projects like - Colonial Hearth Day, the Colonial Kitchen Garden, Franklin County Grist Mill Inventory, Recreational Bicycle Mapping and the Early College High School - that benefit our community. BreadWorks - an Administrative Project - focuses upon growing Society membership and revenues. In 2016, the Society became Business Partner to the Franklin County Early College High School (ECHS) and my personal involvement skyrocketed. The beneficial impacts of the ECHS Project upon our community are becoming remarkable (see PAGES 2-3). All Projects involve my participation to some degree for grant writing, public relations and presentations.

Franklin County Early College High School (ECHS) Project

We continue to work closely with ECHS Principal, Erica Shoulders-Royster. The Society Board of Directors expanded our commitment to ECHS "where we can have immediate impacts upon Student Instruction" and elevated our ECHS Project to "Signature Project"

On May 5th, we prepared and served Lunch for the Teachers and Staff during "Teacher Appreciation Week". On May 17th, Bob attended the FCEF's year-end "Business Partner" Meeting held at Wake Electric in Youngsville. On May 25th, Bob attended Commencement Exercises for ECHS held in the Auditorium at Louisburg High School and was given special recognition for the work BFS has done this school year. With all EOG Testing now completed, we anxiously await to hear if ECHS has earned an "A" Rating!

Currently, ECHS only has ONE Computer Teaching Cart with 30 Chromebook Computers being shared by over 200 Students; Dr. Mubenga, Suberintendent of FC Schools, has earmarked TWO additional GCC Carts; the BEN FRANKLIN SOCIETY has bledged to donate ONE GCC Cart; and Bob Radcliffe has submitted a Grant Proposal to NOVOZYMES for THREE GCC Carts - hopefully providing a total of SEVEN GCC Carts that can service each of the 210 students in the upcoming Fall Term; each new fully equipped Teaching Cart is estimated to cost \$7800. We have been notified by Novozymes that a decision on our Grant Proposal will be announced soon.

While preparing the NOVOZYMES Proposal, Bob discovered that the we must pay NC Sales Tax on all purchases - that's nearly \$500 per GCC Cart!. See his Franklin Times Letter to the Editor on PAGE-3 - a reworked version of which has been submitted to the Raleigh News&Observer on June 1st.. Bob has met with State Senator Chad Barefoot, contacted Keith Poston with www.NCForum.org, and met with Franklin County Finance Director, Chuck Murray, on June 20th to document the County's Sales Tax Rebate Workflow.

Why do NC schools pay sales tax, await rebates?

Dear editor

My work through the Ben Franklin Society with the Franklin County Early College High School (ECHS), has convinced me of the dire need for basic student instructional materials - that's computers and books!

I have recently been shocked to learn that North Carolina is one of only five states (AZ, CA, NC, SC and WA) that collects sales tax on public school purchases (computers, books, supplies etc) - that's 6.75 percent in Franklin County.

At a time when the State Legislature is effectively cutting public school funding, expanding the school voucher program, and lowering the tax rate for corporations - that sales tax amounts to a lot of money, that otherwise could provide essential classroom instructional materials.

Why is NC taxing public school purchases?

What do the other 45 states know that NC doesn't?

In my humble opinion this is a glar-

ing example of bad public policy!

If you are told that counties can apply for a sales tax rebate, ask, "why then collect the tax to begin with?"

The purchases must first be made by the school system, then any rebates returned at a later time to the county (but not necessarily to the county school system — not to mention the cash flow considerations and administrative costs of the rebate program at both the county and state level.

Simply eliminate the sales tax on public school purchases!
