DC CLASS TRIP FUNDRAISER UPDATE

ECHS English Teacher, Elizabeth Grothmann, has spear-heading the school's first DC Class Trip scheduled for May 4-5th. Kerry Carter and Linda Lamb prepared the food, Stella Jones and Doug Ross performed and over 25 attended on Saturday, April 21st and enabled us to raise over \$1000. Special recognition goes to Linda Lamb for her housekeeper's \$500 Business contribution.

STEM GARDEN UPDATE

The seeds planted on March 9th have germinated with better progress showing in the cold frames as expected, but also under the row cover cloth and even in the bare soil raised beds sections. The weather has been very cold and wet, but the seedlings (lettuce, cabbage, spinach and radish) are surviving! Students are also experimenting with seed germination at home - standard seed germination rate test protocol between damp paper towels - varying the water pH to see the effects. Some initial harvesting is planned for May 3rd. Ken Billings and Bob Radcliffe will continue to provide help as needed.

ECHS MEDIAN LANDSCAPE PLAN

Kerry Carter is working with Tim Hanauer of Triangle Land Art to capture some preliminary ideas about how to improve the utility and beauty of the Median area between ECHS and VGCC. The ECHS property has very limited outdoor space. Our thought is to maximize the use of the median by creating a long-term landscape design that could be incrementally implemented over time. Most certainly, the FCSS would have to approve any such plan. We hope this step on our part will begin a discussion of its merits, and ultimate approval.




