Preparatory work began in December 2018, with a visit to NCDCR in Raleigh, to meet new Archaeology Site Registrar, Rosie Blewitt-Golsch. A prototype Mill Site filing process has been developed that now enables us to proceed and finally accomplish the goals of this Project that Bob started in 2008. We successfully completed our first Archaeological Site Filing on December 11[™], 2018. The **WHITAKER MILL on Lynch Creek** was assigned the **OSA-ID 31FK165**. Each Site is assigned a permanent Site-ID by the OSA Site Registrar. As we complete and submit each Final Site Report, we will post redacted PDF versions on our BFS website. We encourage you to download and review these Site Reports. Our Field Trips record missing GPS Coordinates and Photography, so that additional Site Reports can be finalized.

SOCIETY PROJECT ABSTRACTS

Preliminary investigative work has been initiated by Bob Radcliffe on two matters that could potentially become Society Projects. To date, formal Project Applications have not been submitted, nor have any Society Funds been allocated. The following Abstracts are provided to transparently update Society Members who may ultimately be requested to vote upon accepting these Initiatives as Society Projects - which may then qualify for funding. Our Society BY-LAWS define how Society Projects are created, managed and funded.

LOUISBURG COLLEGE ECONOMIC IMPACT STUDY

In 2019, I noticed that BFS had not received any business meeting bookings from Louisburg College (LBC) since former President, Dr. Mark LaBranche departed in the Fall of 2017. Shortly after he departed, my father's hospitalizations diverted my attention from this fact. After making a few inquiries, I learned that LBC enrollments were down and layoffs had occurred. Our financial impacts were clearly due to a lack of funds, not the quality of our services. I also came to understand the deepening controversy surrounding the Campus Confederate Statue on Main Street and the College's increased minority enrollment.

What began as a business relationship that needed my attention, evolved into a genuine concern for the health and vitality of Louisburg College itself. The more I pondered this matter, the more convinced I became that an Economic Impact Study could provide a sorely needed "Missing Perspective" - thus forming the foundation of a BFS Project.

FRANKLIN COUNTY HOMELESS SHELTER

What began as a simple commitment to help fix the Smartphone of a homeless individual, morphed into how to get the people off-the-streets of Louisburg. While doing so, a broader concern evolved that questions "Why Franklin County lacks a Homeless Shelter?"

My work thus far to help Bob Shiles has been incredibly revealing. Why should a college educated, career investigative reporter, be homeless and living at fast food restaurants on the Boulevard? In a County with over 100 churches, community outreach police, EMS and social service resources, and an new animal shelter - "Why is there no Homeless Shelter available?"

The common answer I have found is that we don't have a homeless problem - although Franklin Times editor, Gary Cunard, has reported that the FC School System reports it has over 200 homeless students. I also hear that Franklin County simply transports the homeless to neighboring counties that have shelters - like Wake and Durham.

I discovered that Bob Shiles, now age 63, qualified for Social Security and should not ever have been on-the-street. Many advised him to get Social Security, but IT IS IMPOSSIBLE when you don't have a permanent address. In fact no one can get a PO BOX, Checking Account or file for Social Security if you do not have proof of a Resident Address.

It would appear that an overnight walk-in shelter could very economically be provided, that provides basic heat/light, bathroom/shower facilities and security - no food service is necessary - with daily hours restricted from 6:00pm to 6:00am. Why can't this be provided?


